WHEREAS, Thirty-Five (35) licensees operating at the locations in the Town of Bridgewater desire authorization to continue the operation of its establishments; and

WHEREAS, Alcohol and attendant licenses are subject to renewal annually; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Massachusetts General Law Chapter 304 of the Acts of 2004, all requisite inspections have been completed by the Inspector of Buildings and Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector's Office has submitted its recommendation for the renewal candidates; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Massachusetts General Law Chapter 138 § 16A , a retail license "*shall be automatically renewed for the next annual license period upon application by the holder thereof during the month of November and shall be automatically renewed...provided that said license is of the same type as the expiring license and covers the same licensed premises*"; and

WHEREAS, the Bridgewater Town Council, acting as the Legislative body of the Town has such licensing authority with consideration of no adverse recommendations being received from the Bridgewater Building Inspector, Fire, Police, and Health Departments who have oversight authority, it appears that the public good so requires such license be granted;

The Town Council of the Town of Bridgewater, Massachusetts, pursuant to Chapter 138 - § 16A (alcohol licenses); Chapter 140 § 2, 4 (common victualler); Chapter 140 § 22-32 (innholders); Chapter 140 § 177A (auto amusements); Chapter 140 § 181 and 183A (annual entertainment) respectively of the Massachusetts General Law (M.G.L.), in Town Council assembled approve the petitions, as submitted, and that the individual applicants be granted a license to continue its operations for a period of one year - January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

General Ordinance - Amend Article II Sec 2-1. Composition; Eligibility; Term of Office

~~WHEREAS~~, an amendment to Article II, Section 2-1 of the Bridgewater Town Charter;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the General Laws of the Commonwealth, the Town Council assembled has adopted a town precinct map dividing the territory of the town into nine (9) voting precincts consisting of, as nearly as possible, an equal number of inhabitants and each consist of fewer than four thousand inhabitants;

WHEREAS, due to the above referenced precinct map the Town Council must now amend the makeup of the Town Council;

WHEREAS, Article 89, Section 8 of the Massachusetts Constitution allows the legislative body of the Town of Bridgewater to vote to submit a Special Act to the State Legislature to Amend the current Charter of the Town;

ORDERED, that the Town Council assembled votes to amend the ~~Town Charter~~ Bridgewater Home Rule Charter, Article II, Section 2-1 to read and to send said amendment to the State Legislature as a Special Act as follows:

Section 2-1 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

SECTION 2-1. COMPOSITION; ELIGIBILITY; TERM OF OFFICE

- (a) **Composition** - There shall be a town council consisting of ~~xxx~~ **nine** members which shall exercise the legislative powers of the town. ~~xxx~~ **Three** of these members, ~~are to be known as~~ **District** **C**ouncilors, shall be nominated and elected by and from the voters of the ~~xxx~~ **three** **D**istricts into which the town is divided and ~~xxx~~ **six** of the members to be known as **C**ouncilors-at-Large, shall be nominated and elected by and from the voters at large.
- (b) **Eligibility** - Any voter shall be eligible to hold the office of **C**ouncilor-at-Large. A **D**istrict **C**ouncilor must be a voter and resident of the **D**istrict in which election is sought. If a **D**istrict **C**ouncilor or a **C**ouncilor-at-Large moves out of the town during the term for which elected, such office shall immediately be deemed vacant and filled in the manner provided in section 2-5. If a **D**istrict **C**ouncilor moves from the **D**istrict from which the councilor is elected, or is removed by a change in **D**istrict lines, and more than 14 months remains of the term for which elected, the office shall be deemed vacant and shall be filled in the manner provided in section 2-5. If less than 6 months of the term remains, the **D**istrict **C**ouncilor who remains a resident of the town may continue to serve during the term for which elected.

NOT FOR ACTION – FIRST READING ONLY

- (c) Term of Office – After completion of the transitional terms as outlined in Section 10-7, the term of office of District Councilors and Councilors-at-Large shall be staggered terms of 3 years each, beginning on the second Monday next business day following election and continuing until their successors are qualified.

EXPLANATION:

This begins the process of what we know will be some change in the makeup of the precincts in Bridgewater due to the recent census. The Town Clerk will make a recommendation to the Council as to what the makeup should be, but the Council will have the final say. This puts the issue in committee so discussions can begin to take place as the timeline for this process will be tight.

ORDERED, that the Town Council assembled votes to amend the Bridgewater Home Rule Charter, Article VII, Section 7-4 and to send said amendment to the State Legislature as a Special Act as follows:

Section 7-4. “Districts” shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

Section 7-4. “Precincts and Districts”

The territory of the town shall be divided into nine (9) precincts (“Precincts”) as specifically illustrated on the attached Precinct map which shall be appended to the Town of Bridgewater Home Rule Charter. The Town of Bridgewater shall also be divided into three (3) districts (“Districts”). Each District shall be comprised of three (3) Precincts as illustrated herein and as established in accordance with the General Laws. Said Districts have been established as to consist of as nearly an equal number of inhabitants as it is possible to achieve based on compact and contiguous territory, bounded insofar as possible by the center line of known streets or ways or by other well-defined limits. The Town Council shall from time to time, but at least once in each ten (10) years, review such Districts to ensure their uniformity in number of inhabitants. The composition of the three (3) Districts stated herein shall consist of the Precincts as set forth herein:

District 2: Precincts 5, 6 and 8.

Bridgewater Home Rule Charter, Article I, Section 1-9 “Definitions” is hereby amended by adding the following words:

“Precinct”, is the smallest geographically bounded unit used for election purposes and must be bounded by the center-line of streets or other well defined boundaries such as streams or other bodies of water, railroad tracks, power lines or other clearly visible geographic figures.

“District”, is a geographically bounded unit for election purposes, which consists of one or more contiguous precincts.

EXPLANATION:

This establishes definitions for “Precinct” and “District” within the Charter to support the reprecincting changes proposed elsewhere in the document. The proposed definitions borrow language from the “Reprecincting in Massachusetts” presentation published by the Office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth on April 14, 2021.

WHEREAS, Article 89, Section 8 of the Massachusetts Constitution allows the legislative body of the Town of Bridgewater to vote to submit a Special Act to the State Legislature to Amend the current Charter of the Town;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the General Laws of the Commonwealth, the Town Council assembled has adopted a town precinct map dividing the territory of the town into nine (9) voting precincts consisting of, as nearly as possible, an equal number of inhabitants and each consist of fewer than four thousand inhabitants;

WHEREAS, due to the above referenced precinct map the Town Council must now amend the makeup of the Town Council to include more At-Large positions which carry our highest nomination signature requirement;

WHEREAS, with the above referenced new town precinct map and new makeup of the Town Council, the Town Council seeks to remove barriers to participating and ensure equitable access for all residents who seek town offices;

WHEREAS, excessive nomination signature requirements are recognized to be a significant barrier to participation and limit equitable access to town office positions;

WHEREAS, The Town of Bridgewater’s existing nomination signature requirements are up to ten times higher than nearby communities with far larger populations;

ORDERED, that the Town Council assembled votes to amend the Bridgewater Home Rule Charter, Article VII, Section 7-3 and to send said amendment to the State Legislature as a Special Act as follows:

Section 7-3(a) “Signature Requirements” shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

- (a) Signature Requirements – The number of signatures of voters required to place the name of a candidate on the official ballot to be used at an election shall be as follows: For an office which is to

be filled by the voters of the whole town, not less than 60. For an office which is to be filled by the voters of a District, not less than 40 from the District.

EXPLANATION:

This ordinance addresses potential participation and equity barriers associated with our shift from a majority District Councilor to a majority At-Large Councilor model by reducing the signature requirements for town-wide positions from 150 to 60 and District positions from 100 to 40. This change brings us into alignment with policies in neighboring towns and encourages more equitable participation and access to potential candidates.

WHEREAS, an amendment to Article X, Section 10-7 of the Bridgewater Town Charter is necessary to facilitate transition to certain amended provisions of the Bridgewater Town Charter;

ORDERED, that the Town Council assembled votes to amend the Town Charter, Article X, Section 10-7 to read as follows:

This Charter shall become fully effective upon ratification by the voters as provided for by the General Laws, except as provided in this section:

Section 10-7. Time of Taking Effect.

Upon the ratification of the Charter by the voters at the annual town election:

- (a) The election to elect the initial Town Council under this Charter shall be the annual town election scheduled to be conducted on April 30, 2022; and
- (b) The officials elected hereunder to serve upon the initial Town Council shall take office immediately upon election and certification, subject to the following transitional provisions:
 1. The term of office of any District Councilor serving on the date of the annual town election shall immediately expire and the term of office of each District Councilor elected hereunder shall commence upon certification of election.
 2. The term of office of any Councilor-at-Large serving on the date of the annual town election shall immediately expire and the term of office of each Councilor-at-Large elected hereunder shall commence upon certification of election, provided, however, that any Councilor-at-Large previously

elected and serving on the date of the annual town election but not having fulfilled his full term of office shall be entitled to serve the remainder of the term for which he was elected to serve.

3. The term of office of the District Councilor elected to serve District 2 shall expire upon the first anniversary of the approval of the charter by the voters and upon election and certification of his successor.
4. The term of office of the District Councilor elected to serve District 1 shall expire upon the second anniversary of the approval of the Charter by the voters and upon election and certification of his successor.
5. The term of office of the District Councilor elected to serve District 3 shall expire upon the third anniversary of the approval of the Charter by the voters and upon election and certification of his successor.
6. The term of office of any Councilor-at-Large elected upon approval of the Charter by the voters shall accord with the below-indicated transitional term of office, each such term as shall have been determined by the ballot bearing his name:
 - a) Three-Year Term:
Two (2) Councilors-at-Large shall serve upon election and certification with each term of office to expire upon the third anniversary of approval of the Charter by the voters and upon election and certification of their respective successors.
 - b) Two-Year Term:
One (1) Councilor-at-Large shall serve upon election and certification with his term of office to expire upon the second anniversary of approval of the Charter by the voters and upon election and certification of his successor.
 - c) One-Year Term:
Two (2) Councilors-at-Large shall serve upon election and certification with each such term of office to expire upon the first anniversary of approval of the Charter by the voters and upon election and certification of their respective successors.

The Town of Bridgewater recently applied for financial assistance through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Program for the Bridgewater Morris Avenue Wastewater Treatment Plant Phase 1 Upgrades project (CWSRF-6838).

The Town is conducting this project in accordance with an Administrative Consent Order (CWA-AO-R01-FY17-10) the town is being held to by the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) and MassDEP. The consent order includes strict timelines to complete construction of Phase 1 and Phase 2 Nutrient Removal Projects. Phase I is required to be completed by May 1, 2024. The project is on track to meet this deadline.

The 95% design was submitted to MassDEP on October 15, 2021 by Stantec, the design Engineer. Environmental Partners, the Owners Project Manager has completed the peer review of the 95% design and Stantec is currently working on the 100% design, to be completed by January 2022. Local permit approvals are underway.

To receive the Clean Water Trust and MassDEP Project Approval Certificate (PAC) and Permission to Advertise in February 2022, certification of the appropriation for the entire project from design/construction through startup is required. The Town appropriated a total of **\$33,750,000 in 2019** for the project based on the Weston and Sampson Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan cost estimates (2017, ENR 10737), as approved by MassDEP in 2019.

As part of the 95% design submission, an Opinion of Probable Construction Cost (OPCC) was prepared by an independent construction cost estimator utilizing the 95% design drawings and specifications. The OPCC, plus the maximum SRF allowable pre-bid contingency of 10%, increases the construction estimate to **\$35,382,323**. Including construction administration, Resident Project Representatives, and Startup and Training, the total project cost is now **\$42,843,377** (November 2021, ENR 12647).

In order to keep our low-interest Clean Water Trust loan, and to remain eligible for Zero Percent Interest and Principal Forgiveness, we must appropriate the **\$9,100,000** gap prior to advertising for construction bids. We cannot receive our full PAC without having the Town Council appropriation.

Several factors contributed to the increased construction cost estimates for Phase 1 Upgrades to the Bridgewater WWTF. Specifically:

1. **Escalation to Midpoint and Inflation Uncertainty.** There is a great deal of uncertainty as inflation continues to ramp up. Specifically, supply chain disruption due to the long-term effects of COVID 19 have resulted in an increase of escalation to mid-point of construction rate increased from **3.5% to 5.0%**.
2. **Water & Wastewater Equipment Costs.** Supply chain uncertainty and lead time issues are affecting cost and openness of suppliers to hold pricing firm. Some suppliers will now only quote firm prices at order time.
3. **Average labor cost** increased from \$94.50/hr. to \$101.64/hr.
4. **Concrete material cost** increased.
 - a. Wall concrete unit cost increased from \$190/CY to \$495/CY.
 - b. Elevated framed slabs cost increased from \$180/CY to \$505/CY.
5. **Electrical material cost** increased impacted by the following increases in average cost:
 - a. Fitting prices increased by 1.5x.
 - b. Copper price/LB increased by 2x.
 - c. Conduit price/LF increased by 3x.

We respectfully request that you present the need for additional funding of **\$9,100,000** to the Town Council for a **first hearing on December 7, 2021 and second/third reading on December 21, 2021**. We cannot receive a PAC and advertise for construction without an updated Town Council Appropriation. It is imperative to our Consent Order to stay as close to our estimated schedule as possible.

Explanation:

EPA and Massachusetts DEP and as agreed to by the Town per an administrative consent order signed in 2018.

- *Phase I work was funded with a **\$250,000** transfer from Reserve Capital for pre-design tasks, and was approved under Order O-FY19-008.*
- ***\$1.5M** for Preliminary and Final Design will be funded through Sewer Reserve Funds*
- ***\$32,000,000** was appropriated for Procurement, construction and project closeout through Council Order O-FY19-052*
- *This project is on the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Intended Use Plan FY21.*
- *Additional funds are required due to escalation costs on equipment and materials due to COVID 19 impacts.*
